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






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

Acknowledging the truth of these realities is critical to building mutual respect and connection.



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A NOTE FROM THE CONTEMPORARY

William Shakespeare's Hamlet, written over 400 years ago, is widely considered one of his most famous tragedies. James Ijames's Fat Ham, a fiercely contemporary reimagination of that story, is a celebration. A vibrant celebration of survival, love, and the power of joy. The moment we read Fat Ham, we knew we had to include it in our 40th anniversary season. It's a play that's true to our name—a play for our time.

Fat Ham had its first production at the height of the pandemic in a virtual production at the Wilma Theatre. From there, it made its off-Broadway debut in a co-production between The Public Theater and the National Black Theater, won the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, transferred to Broadway, and was nominated for five Tony Awards. We are thrilled to be sharing this production at this time, with this community.

In early January, we were notified that our production of Fat Ham was a recipient of a \$10,000 Challenge America grant from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). It is a great honor to have our work recognized at the national level. With recent changes to federal grants and the NEA, the state of this funding is currently unknown. What we do know is that as a company, we will continue to remain true to our values, vision, and mission. We will continue to create theatre that sparks joy, inspires empathy, and speaks to the current moment.

Thank you for being here and celebrating with us. We hope you leave the theatre feeling as moved and inspired as we have been throughout the journey of bringing Fat Ham to life.
